#### Star Trek TNG Motion Pictures Blu Ray pack

Hi all, just thought I'd give a review of the Next Generation movies that came out on blu ray format recently and wanted to give my take on it in case anyone's considering it, so I will be covering a few areas about it.

The pack comes with the four Next Generation movies which are in order of appearance: Star Trek Generations, Star Trek First Contact, Star Trek Insurrection, and Star Trek Nemesis. It also comes with a 5 disc called Star Trek Evolutions, which is not a movie, but more extras. The price on it is fairly reasonable, which I purchased from Best Buy but I'm sure there are cheaper places on-line but the price in general would break each movie down to \$10 apiece. The packaging is pretty nice, it comes with its own box that contains the 5 discs in their own blu ray containers that are nice and slim. There's even a three-D effect chevron symbol on the outside of the box with a plastic sleeve-like cover that you can choose to leave on or off.



There are many of us that have seen all four movies and will have various opinions on the story lines and etc, so I won't be reviewing anything about them. Rather, I'll talk about video quality because we are talking about high definition blu ray and content which of course contain more than just the movies for each one. Believe me, there's a LOT, which surprised me. I viewed these discs with a Sony blu ray player on a

Vizio 47 inch flat-screen with 1080p/120Mhz refresh rate, just to get an idea of what I watched them with. There are more top-of-the-line TVs that would improve on this. And blu ray players are getting cheaper these days, but can also be played on game devices so I'm told.

Each one of these discs contain the same menu formats which are pretty visually appealing. The menu itself is a bar that goes across the bottom of the screen and simply to navigate through. The background shows a changing screen that shows the Trek chevron symbol in a beautiful blue color outlined in silver, which alternates between a star field, warp speed, and back again, while playing the them music of that particular movie.

#### **Star Trek Generations**

Having seen the blu ray standalone of Star Trek VI: The Undiscovered Country, I had a little bit of a high expectation of the quality of the movie since VI looked real good. Generations didn't disappoint, the colors were rich and wondrous, the details were sharp as could be and the sound was very nice, and I'm sure with a good stereo system, the sound would be even better. There were a few subtle changes throughout the movie, but none that detract from the story so no point in bringing them up unless you're one of those die-hard detailed about every second of the movie kind of people. Suffice to say, it was actually quite pleasant watching this movie again but in the blu ray format.

Now on to the extras. Wow, there were a lot to choose from and the amount of content covers a wide area. Many of these areas or categories are repeated on all 4 movie discs, including a science officer briefing for each film regarding a subject that's part of the plot device of the movies, such as in Generations, trilithium. I've seen some of the content, but there are more to watch which I haven't seen as of this writing. Lots of behind-the-scenes information, production videos of how they do certain scenes like the crash of the Saucer section(now THAT was interesting), and so forth. There are some video segments that aren't directly involved with the movie itself, but about a subject, such as in this case of Generations, Stellar Cartography on Earth discussed by scientists as well as a tribute to Matt Jefferies which I highly recommend everyone to watch. Not bad over all.

#### **Star Trek First Contact**

As I mentioned before regarding Generations, the video quality was quite good and quite colorful in First Contact, everything was sharp and clear, even more so than Generations. It was so good in fact that I replayed the star ships/cube battle scene in the beginning because of little details I never noticed when I saw it on DVD. The sound was good as well, and again, if you have a good stereo system, you could play the segment where Picard was listening to Berlioz in his ready room to make everything shake. But don't be surprised if the neighbors ask you to turn the noise down. Overall, very good in blu ray format.

Extras: like before, there were similar categories FULL of information about the making of the movie, the special effects, and so forth. Plenty for those of you who want to see what it took to make things happen, including the "Money Shot" of the Borg Queen's shoulders/head being lowered onto the attaching body. And of course, other features shown in the extras not directly related to the movie, but interesting overall as well.

#### **Star Trek Insurrection**

Visually speaking, this movie was stunning, with the Briar Patch, the planet the Ba'Ku reside on, not to mention the beautiful location shots that were used, all these things really shine in high definition. The video quality was so good it appeared almost as if it were "live" as opposed to "film." If anything, I really enjoyed watching this movie just for the quality of the video. The costumes worn by the actors on planet came out real nicely, you can see the textures more clearly, even the leather jacket that Jean Luc Picard wore while leading the people to the mountains. Overall, even better in Blu Ray than First Contact.

Extras: This showed a few more interesting things especially how it was done when Jonathon Frakes directed this third movie and how much they had to work on this, including a segment called "Director's Notebook" where he talks candidly about making the movie. Like the previous ones, some extra features added not

directly related to the movie, but very interesting overall.

#### **Star Trek Nemesis**

Ah, yes, the movie that ended the franchise as people sometimes say. Having said that, let's set that aside and look at the video quality. I must say that I was quite a bit disappointed in this one. I had high expectations in the previous ones in that each one got better than the last and expected more of the same if not better. In fact, I even checked to see if I somehow altered my video settings(which I didn't)and ejected the movie to make sure it wasn't somehow damaged or that it wasas a DVD instead of a blu ray, but according to the player, it was a blu That's not to say there were artifacts or imaging problems, but it was a bit grainy in many areas, even in the brightly lit segments of the movie. The sound quality was good as before at least. Compared to the other three, a bit disappointing. I wasn't a big fan of the movie, but I was hoping for something of good video quality at least, given that the movie was made in 2002 and video imaging quality should get better all the time. Oh well.

On extras, just like the previous ones, lots of information, different subjects as before both related to and not related to the movie. Overall, not bad.

I'd give this package between an A-minus and a B-plus if only because of the video quality of Nemesis. This would make a nice addition to a blu ray collection and I'm glad I made that choice because I did like the first three movies and really enjoy watching Frakes' movies as he's a very good director.(He's done many others as well as other TV shows)
