Cadet Services Report

Ark Angel Cadet Corps' First Special Ops Mission-SUCCESS!

This Spring Break marked the first annual Spring Special Ops Mission for the Ark Angel Cadet Corps. Our current cadets-Cadet 2nd Class Claire Bressie and Cadet 4th Class Aiden Bressie-raised funds for St. Jude's Children's Hospital and participated in Math-A-Thon events appropriate for their grade level.

The cadets started their fundraising mid-February. They sent out emails, collecting donations from their family, friends, and teachers. They also posted notices on the Ark Angel Station and Region 3 Facebook pages and Yahoo! groups, as well as to the STARFLEET Academy Yahoo! group. Each cadet was given a fundraising

goal of \$100 by March 17. Both cadets surpassed their goals by raising \$125 each. In total, the Ark Angel Cadet Corps raised \$250 for St. Jude's Children's Hospital!

Cadet Claire completed 20 pages of math problems at the fourth-grade level, including single through triple-digit multiplication, fractions, word and story problems, and tessellations. Cadet Aiden completed 20 pages of math problems at the first-grade level, including addition, subtraction, comparisons, and number lines. Both cadets worked really hard on their math funbooks, and completed two copies-one for St. Jude's and one to turn in to their teachers at school for extra credit.


